COVID-19 AND FLU VACCINES

The Immunization Clinic at Naval Hospital Bremerton (located on the 3rd Floor, Family Care Center, next to Pediatrics) has initial COVID-19 and Flu vaccines available on a walk-in basis for patients ages 6 months and older.

Tuesdays: 0945-1145 and 1300-1530



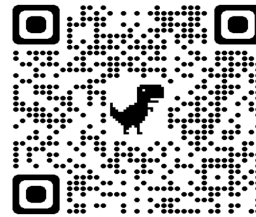

SELF-CARE GUIDANCE

Patients with a **positive (+) COVID-19 home test and symptoms, should stay home and follow the CDC guidelines for isolation** (www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/quarantine-isolation.html).

At-home COVID-19 tests are also now available at no cost at many organizations throughout Kitsap County, such as food banks or library branches.



If sick with **FLU** symptoms, **stay home and avoid contact with other people** except to get medical care.

Patients with respiratory symptoms in a higher-risk group, or very sick and/or worried about your illness may call the **Puget Sound Military Appointing Center (PSMAC)** at **1-800-404-4506** to **schedule an appointment** with their primary care manager (PCM) for evaluation, testing may be performed at that time as necessary.

PSMAC hours of operation: Monday - Friday 0600-1800; closed Saturday and Sunday

After Hours and Weekends: Patients may utilize the Urgent Care Clinic for evaluation or call the **Nurse Advice Line** at **1-800-874-2273 (option 1)** any time, 24 hours a day/7 days a week, for home care advice.

COVID-19 TESTING

COVID-19 TEST-AND-GO SERVICES ARE NO LONGER AVAILABLE at the hospital.

Official and Operational Travel Testing: Contact your respective Primary Care Clinic for guidance and testing.

Pre-Operative Testing: Contact your surgeon for further instructions and testing information.

Confirmatory Testing: Highly encouraged for Active Duty members, but not required. Contact your PCM.
